This is the year we officially become part of the Mountain Sky Conference, joining our legacy Yellowstone Conference with the legacy Rocky Mountain Conference. Celebrate! Through your generosity, in 2019 Big Horn UMW units and members gave \$38,135 to mission. Those dollars go to helping women, youth and children... it's a powerful testament to your Christian commitment. Blessings and thanks!

Of the \$38,135, \$28,448 went to Pledge to Mission, \$1,240 to Special Mission Recognition (pins), \$145 to Gift to Mission (cards), \$591 to Gift in Memory, \$1,744 to World Thank Bank (the Five Channels of Giving) – plus \$1,499 to Call to Prayer, \$2,767 to Designated Gifts and \$1,700 to the Legacy Fund.

Nine units in the Big Horn District achieved "Five Star Status" for 2019. These units will receive a special award at our spring meeting in Huntley.

Have you kept track of the books from the reading program list that you have read? If you have, and if you qualify for one of the levels on the reading program, please send me your name, unit name, and what level you have attained as soon as possible. You can count books read from the 2014 – 2019 reading lists that have not been previously reported. Reading the *Response* magazine is also part of the requirements. Reading program certificates will be handed out at the April district meeting in Huntley. You can email the info to me at stanjan504@yahoo.com or mail to: 504 Pickens Rd, Huntley, MT 59037.

I will have a dozen each of the *Mission u* study books available at the April district meeting in Huntley. The 2020 Spiritual Growth Study is *Finding Peace in an Anxious World*. The Issue Study is *The Criminalization of Black Girls in Schools*. If you prefer, units or individuals can place orders by calling Mission Resources at 1-800-305-9857 and asking for Andrew Cheu.

As many of you know, Mission Resources is no longer selling the books on the UMW Reading Program list. The 2020 reading program information was published in the Nov/Dec issue of *Response*. You can order books from Cokesbury, but they may not carry all the titles on the reading list. Or, you may be able to purchase some of the books at your local bookstore or library. Another suggestion is to order from Amazon or another on-line store. I was able to find the books that were on the 2019 reading list at Amazon.com and at a lower price than Cokesbury. If cost is a factor, you may find that some of the titles are available as used books. When looking at the used books, Amazon describes their condition so you will know what you are getting. Many people use Amazon.com so it is likely you know someone in your unit who has an Amazon Prime account and can get the books within a few days with no shipping cost. If you do use Amazon for your order, please use smile.amazon.com and select UMW and Amazon will make a donation of 0.5% of the cost to UMW. I hope this information will be useful. I know many units/individuals still want to buy reading program books, but are also concerned about the cost. Let me know if you have any questions.

Along with reading from the UMW reading list, I would also encourage everyone to be reading what we used to call <u>current events</u> when we were in grade school. You all know 2020 is an election year. We will be bombarded with TV ads, print news and internet articles - more information than we can possibly absorb. But, we need to educate ourselves about candidates and issues over the next 10 months in order to make good choices. As Americans this is our right and duty. Social Action:

This is the fourth year of the current advocacy emphasis:

- Criminalization of communities of color, with a focus on disrupting the school-to-prison pipeline
- Maternal and child health with a focus on ending maternal mortality everywhere
- Climate justice-reference the 13 Steps of Sustainability and holding corporations accountable for polluting and greenhouse gas emissions
- Challenging economic inequality, with a focus of securing living wages for all. This includes the paid family leave initiatives.

Is your local UMW working on any of these? Maybe, you're discussing them within your group. These issues are sitting right on our front door no matter where you live. Consider trying something new within your group such as helping a day with your local "feeding the homeless", or picking up litter along a highway or park. Give a bible study for women in your local jail/prison. How about sewing or knitting baby blankets/socks/hats/ etc. for newborns? It can even be as simple as choosing a warm day to walk instead of drive somewhere.
