Education and Action

History of Black History

Called the "father of Black History" Carter Goodwin Woodson, an American historian, author and journalist was one of the first scholars to study African American history in the early twentieth century. In 1926 he launched a celebration of "Negro History Week" (sic) designated the second week of February to coincide with the birthdays of both Abraham Lincoln and Fredrick Douglas. Woodson believed that African American contributions "were over-looked, ignored, and even suppressed by the writers of history textbooks and the teachers who use them. " He felt that young African Americans were not being taught enough about their won heritage and achievements of their ancestors. Woodson's idea to celebrate and recognize contributions of Black Americans gained in popularity and importance over the decades. In 1970 Black educators and the Black United Students at Kent State University expanded their teaching activities and celebrations to a full month holding the first Black History Month. President Gerald Ford in 1976 recognized Black History Month during the celebration of the United States Bicentennial urging Americans to "seize the opportunity to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of Black Americans in every endeavor throughout our history."

So, it is in this spirit and towards this endeavor that I refer you to our United Methodist Women's website at http://www.unitedmethodistwomen.org/racial justice where you will find resources for Black History Month and racial justice including a Black History quiz, books about Harriet Tubman (She Came to Slay) and the contributions of a core of Black women whose expertise and knowledge was significant to the success of projects at NASA (Hidden Figures) along with other articles and videos.

Missoula First UMW

The UMW of Missoula First UMC has kept their mission coffers flowing during the pandemic. Since circles and groups were not meeting in person, and church services were still hybrid, we took a "leap of faith" and promoted the usual fundraising activities on-line and changed the methods of delivery. Thus, the Ash Wednesday Souper and Bread Supper was advertised on-line and in the bulletin about what types and how many pints of soup could be ordered. The soups were prepared at home, ladled into pints in the church kitchen by UMW (masked and gloved), and placed in paper bags with bread or rolls to be picked up at a designated time and paid for at the church back door. Spring and Christmas cookie and candy sales were handled the same way with on-line orders. All baked goods were assembled in the kitchen on paper plates, placed in zip lock bags, labeled, and sold each at \$5.00 for an assorted plate, and picked up. If designated items couldn't be picked up, they were gladly delivered. Our famous apple pie sales were done in the same fashion. All in all, where there was a will, there was a way, and fundraising was just as successful as ever. Thanks be to God!



Next Mission u Study

"Bearing Witness in the Kin-dom: Living into the Church's Moral Witness through Radical Discipleship"

Save the summer dates for this virtual study: Consecutive Wednesday Evenings: July 13, 30, 27 and August 3 (7:00-9:30 p.m.). Mission u Dean Kathryn Witte will be the study leader for this course. The book is written by Darryl W. Stephens, and it can be purchased online for \$10. In Jesus' own words, he came to bring good news to the poor, release the captives, restore sight to the blind, and to let the oppressed go free. What is the responsibility of the church to follow Christ's example in word and deed? While these times might feel particularly turbulent, society has always confronted the church with challenging issues where she has had to discern how God was calling her. The church's track record in these moments is far from perfect. The purpose of this study is to help the church and its members discern our call and bear witness to the will of God for a more just world.

Looking Ahead to the Future of Mission u New study leaders and new languages. And Luke 13: A Transformative Biblical Curriculum for Adults, Youth and Children

Dean Kathryn Witte, Assistant Dean Belinda Alkula, and new study leader trainees Courtney Randall, Charlene Elliott, Araceli Berguda and Gaylene Maka are signed up for the upcoming leader training scheduled for several days and times in April. We are most excited about adding leaders who will teach in **Spanish** (Araceli Berguda) and in **Tongan** (Gaylene Maka). Additionally, Courtney Randall, who is also the Mission Advocate for the Western Jurisdiction, is planning to focus on the **youth study**.

Beginning with 2022, a new model of *Mission u* curricula will be introduced following the April training. Instead of creating separate studies that examine spiritual growth, justice, and national and global social issues, we are integrating these commitments into one curriculum. This means there will be one curriculum for adults, one for youth and one for children. In 2022, all three curricula (adults, youth, children) will be on the topic of Luke 13. Our goals are to make this curriculum widely adaptable and easy to use in districts, units, local churches and Sunday schools, as well as to create intentional opportunities for intergenerational learning.

At the end of the **Luke 13 study**, our hope is that participants will leave with a bigger and broader vision of the kind of community Christ is calling us to be in times of loss, grief, and massive disruption. What would be possible if we tend to the needs of our communities in small and often disruptive ways as Jesus did in Luke 13? May we do so with the faith that a multitude of small actions, like seeds, can activate a community's healing and renewal.


Who Can We BeTogether? 2022 Adult Curriculum




Community in the Midst of Challenging Times 2022 Youth Curriculum




