Giving helps Colegio Sara Alarcón put high tech spin on Methodist education.

As a young child, Citalli Crespo loved taking things apart.

"I started ... playing, and then I would assemble it again," the 14-year-old student said, laughing. "I started, like, 'how does this work?' And then I would take it apart. And there were times that I couldn't do it again. And they said to me, 'Can you? Can you repair it?'"

Sometimes Crespo could put things back together on her own, and sometimes she needed help from her parents, both engineers. These days, Crespo enjoys using that same curiosity in her robotics class at Colegio Sara Alarcón, where funding from **United Women in Faith** has helped the bilingual school purchase five humanoid robots that Crespo and her classmates are learning to program. United Women in Faith may be helping the school, but it's the help within its hallways and classrooms that keeps students coming back. Every student interviewed said bullying does not exist at Sara Alarcón.

"I didn't have any trouble with anyone," said Santana. "I feel so comfortable here with the people in our community. They really listen to you. ... You can count on them. ... They are so supportive of you."



"Living the Kin-dom: Exploring the Lord's Prayer as a Spiritual Practice for Social Transformation."



THIS STUDY BY RIVA TABELISMA gives fresh eyes to the Lord's Prayer. Often learned by rote, the Lord's Prayer is a rich guide for how we can live out God's kindom in our lives. Tabelisma

invites participants in this study to step away from our automatic recitation of the prayer and take a dive deep into the meaning of each line over the course of eight one-hour sessions. Each of the sessions examines a section of the Lord's Prayer from Matthew 6:9–13 as it is recorded in the New Revised Standard Version of the Bible.

Living the Kin-dom can be adapted to a variety of settings outside of the Mission u format, including Sunday school and other church school settings. Adaptations for virtual gatherings are also provided.



Frasier Meadows Update

Hi, my other hat for the Mountain Sky Conference is serving as the United Women in Faith liaison to the Frasier Meadows Retirement Community Board. Our sisters, with great foresight, agreed to fund two studio apartments when Frasier was under construction in the late 1950s, with the understanding that deaconesses, missionaries, pastors (and spouses), and Methodist women--who hadn't accumulated equity in a private home—could retire to Frasier without paying the entrance fee and receive a reduced monthly rate for services.

Fast forward sixty-plus years to 2023 and many things have changed. Frasier still has 'deluxe' studio apartments and smaller one-bedroom apartments available for retired clergy, spouses, deaconesses, home missioners, missionaries and United Women in Faith. But most applicants have some equity from home ownership that can be applied to the entrance fee for Frasier. Frasier staff and the Conference team are attempting to create an application process with a simple (one-page) form that would determine whether future residents would qualify for the special UWFaith entrance (and monthly) fees or whether their equity exceeds the original intent of the agreement. If an applicant does qualify, the Conference would provide a letter to Frasier staff endorsing the applicant's inclusion in this program.

Over the years, Frasier has expanded its services to provide a continuum of care from Independent Living to Assisted Living to Memory Care and Health Care. The original agreement didn't address these other living options because they weren't available. Frasier staff are trying to avoid 'sticker shock' for a resident who qualified for a UWFaith apartment by also carrying forward the resident rate for these additional levels of care.

Frasier staff plan to develop a brochure explaining the UWFaith program, the qualifications, descriptions of the apartments, and answers to other questions and then provide the information to retired pastors, missionaries, deaconesses and home missioners, as well as UWFaith members. The Conference team will continue to update all our sisters about Frasier and apartment availability through newsletters and its website. 


