#### Jana Jones, Director


I just got a text from a young man living in Sierra Leone, whom my husband and I have been supporting for the last several years to complete his education. What I have learned is that supporting him is not just about school fees. As with raising your own children, it is also about the phone or laptop that dies, medical expenses, on and on. I rejoice that we are able to help him. He just got married last May, (naturally with our contribution.) The text I just received let me know that his young wife was just hospitalized with appendicitis. She needs to have emergency surgery and \$150 will pay for surgery and medicines. Of course, I immediately sent the money. \$150 may be the difference of life and death for this young woman. One hundred and fifty dollars. I pray that the surgery happens immediately and for the skill of the surgeons and care-givers.

This reminds me of what a difference we all make with our Gifts to Mission in United Women in Faith. Those women, children and youth living in the United States and globally benefit from the money we raise via our pledges, our bake sales, our craft fairs, teas, #Move4Mission, and your many fund raisers. These funds are not spent on frivolous items. They are spent on live-saving support and advocacy for vulnerable communities. These programs are vital to these communities. My giving support, added to yours and all the others is significant. We make a difference. What we are doing now is significant. Yet, how much more could we do if we stepped out in faith and made a bigger effort to increase our unit pledges? Please consider what MORE we can do as sisters in faith in this organization.





#### Books, Movies and TV Shows about Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons

If you are interested in learning more about Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons (MMIP) before the 2023 Annual Gathering in Billings, MT, Oct. 13-14, please consider reading a book, or

watching a movie, documentary, or television show that addresses this important issue.

There are several books, both fiction and non-fiction, that may be of interest, including: Daughter of the Morning Star, by Craig Johnson; Highway of Tears, by Jessica McDiarmid; Searching For Savanna, by Mona Gable.

The ABC television show, Alaska Daily, focuses on Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women in its main story line. The show is available to stream on Hulu.

Before Yellowstone, Taylor Sheridan wrote and directed the movie, Wind River, which focuses on the murder of an indigenous woman on the Wind River reservation in Wyoming. The movie is available to stream or borrow a DVD copy from your local library.

#### **Ubuntu Day of Service Projects at the Annual Gathering**

We will be offering three Ubuntu service projects on the afternoon of Friday, Oct. 13. These include volunteering at the local food bank in Billings, helping at the Free Store--sponsored by five Billings Methodist Churches and operated by Evangelical UMC--and making menstrual hygiene kits for distribution to women and girls in the Billings area. If we have additional time, we also may make general hygiene kits or peanut butter and jelly sandwiches for distribution to the unhoused folks in Billings.

If you are driving, or have a little space in your suitcase, the period packs require:

quart size Ziploc bags, six sanitary napkins, 3 tampons and one wrapped wipe.

The general hygiene kits include:

quart Ziploc bags,
a washcloth,
comb,
hotel-size shampoo and hair conditioner,
hotel-size lotion,
lip balm,
toothbrush,
small toothpaste,
floss,
a nail file and
two wrapped wet wipes.

#### Mission u Update

#### 102 Participate in Summer Mission u

Study leaders Denise Logan, Sandy Barton and Mary Cousins offered an inspiring examination of the Lord's Prayer during this summer's Mission u. Assistant Dean Belinda Alkula helped make it a seamless Zoom experience. Titled "Living the Kin-dom: Exploring the Lord's Prayer as a Spiritual Practice for Social Transformation," study leaders modeled practices to strengthen participants' daily prayer lives.

In addition, participants were led to create sacred spaces in their homes. Using different translations of the Lord's Prayer, participants were encouraged to look at the layered meanings of the prayer and how the words encourage us to live out our faith with, and among, our neighbors. Forgiveness is also key in our understanding of the Lord's Prayer. Conversations around forgiveness resulted in some very meaningful reflections on the difference between forgiving and forgetting - the point being that you don't have to forget to forgive.

Large group discussion, small group breakout sessions, and interactive activities were presented over four consecutive Tuesdays, July 11, 18, 25 and August 1, from 7:00-9:30 p.m. Certificates for 10 hours of continuing education credit were offered for the study.

Training is offered each April via Zoom from the national United Women in Faith office. Registration and training material costs are covered by Mission u. Part two of Living the Kin-dom is the next study with training in April of 2024.

Jesus' teachings in the Gospels proclaim the good news of the kin-dom or reign (basileia) of God. In fact, Jesus mentions the kin-dom 90 times in the Synoptic Gospels! What does the Bible tell us about God's basileia and why do we call it the kin-dom? For Jesus, the kin-dom was not simply something to talk about but something we could live and experience. The new study will focus on living and experiencing the kin-dom.

#### Mission u LIVE!

Yes, we are interested in collaborating to do live Mission u studies. Contact me if you have an idea or have questions. Districts, multiple districts, groups of units, or a large unit could host a live Mission u of the Living the Kin-dom study on the Lord's Prayer. We will offer this through spring 2024. We are currently evaluating having a live 2024 summer Mission u to coincide with the virtual study.

#### Winter Mission u -- Save the Dates -- Sundays, February 4, 11, 18, and 25, from 2:00-4:30 p.m.

The Rev. Su DeBree will return, building on "Finding Peace in an Anxious World," first presented in winter 2020. Exploring how to build and sustain peace, the study will present new material and will offer an updated interpretation for our current time.

Registration is scheduled to open mid-November. Be watching for more information on the study.

# MOUNTAIN SKY CONFERENCE of UNITED WOMEN in FAITH SOCIAL ACTION REPORT JULY 2023

Many of us are still suffering from "Annual Conference hangover." Yes, I attended Annual Conference in person in Colorado Springs in June at First United Methodist Church, going home at night to sleep in my own bed. (smile)

I am especially proud of two petitions that passed this year: One encouraging education about anti-racism and one urging each congregation to develop its own green team. I served on both of the committees sponsoring these petitions and while my personal input was small, I am happy with the passages of both of these petitions.

United Women in Faith has a head start in both of these areas.

Webinars about the care of God's Earth goes back at least 3 years on the United Women in Faith website, and there have been articles in the <u>response magazine</u>, too. Many UWF units have already made their own cloth napkins and long-since pledged to quit using paper plates for refreshments. Some sponsor community gardens and urge the conservation of natural resources. Recycling is second nature for UWF.

UWF has been educating in the area of anti-racism for years. Our reading program contains books every year that awaken us to the still-prevalent problem of racism in its many forms. Our national office often circulates forms for individual messages to government officials advocating for the passage of anti-racism laws and programs. It's so easy just to plug in my name in the form and with a click, mail it to my representatives and senators.

The beauty is that UWF folks are not new to either of these causes. We can share our resources with others and encourage our local congregations to strive for God's will in these areas. Caring for God's Creation is a sacred trust in which we can all take a part. Racial prejudice has no room in our churches and our organizations. Two books from the 2023 Reading Program might start the conversations flowing: The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek is a great story about prejudice. I'm going to read a children's book next—Nibi's Water Song—about a child's search for clean water.

My sisters, we have always been at the front of social justice movements, and we must continue. Educate. Advocate. Participate.

NEW YORK, NY — United Women in Faith, the largest denominational organization for women, today issued a statement regarding the Supreme Court decisions in Students for Fair Admissions v. Harvard, and Students for Fair Admissions v. University of North Carolina. The statement can be attributed to Sally Vonner, general secretary and CEO of United Women in Faith, and Elizabeth Chun Hye Lee, director of mobilization and advocacy for United Women in Faith:

"We are gravely disappointed in this decision, which represents a massive step backwards for racial equity. We are concerned about the immense harm this decision will have on students as well as the long-term precedent of eroding affirmative action. United Women in Faith also joins the United Methodist Church, which <u>previously issued a resolution on affirmative action</u>, and reiterates our support for affirmative action as an important tool in efforts to achieve equity

#### **Linda Cockett - Communications Coordinator**




