

So, before y'all start thinking about your Christmas activities, join us in Ft. Morgan on September 23rd.





From our Social Action Coordinator

The "Faith in Place" and "Just Energy for All" meetings this month will not be for a couple of days yet, so I hope you will find this information about drinking water interesting. In the west, water is a precious commodity and I know a FEW of you are on well water.

Since the 1940s, a class of chemicals called PFAS has been used in everything from food wrappers to waterproof jackers. PFAS are useful because they repel grease, water, and oil. BUT they are incredibly bad for your health. Because they don't break down easily, PFAS accumulate in the environment, earning the nickname "forever chemicals."

Recently, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency moved to regulate the worst of these chemicals in drinking water to reduce the public's exposure. The proposed rule, that WILL BE UP TO utilities to follow, puts a limit on six of the worst forms of PFAS in drinking water. So, please be aware of what your public utilities are doing.

On another matter, my term as your Social Action Coordinator will soon be coming to an end. I would VERY much like to hear from every unit as to what you have been doing in this area. Maybe changing light bulbs in the church, a related book study, racial justice, immigration, sex trafficking, or anything related to justice. Minutes of 2022 Annual Gathering

Trinity District Annual Gathering September 17, 2022 FUMC Fowler, Colorado and via zoom

Leadership Team present: Elaine Allison, Berniece McClure, Yolanda Dietz, Glenda Holcomb, Nette' Smith, Denise Logan, and Elise Rudolph. **Via zoom**: Michaele Ann Buell-McFeeters, Helen Taylor, Frances Graves, Fran McQuiston and Pat Blasi

Clergy present: Pastor Lola West (Fowler, Olney Springs and Manzanola)

President Elaine Allison opened the Gathering and welcomed all. "To God be the Glory" was sung, accompanied by Berniece McClure.

Denise Logan, Coordinator for Spiritual Growth, gave a devotion, "A Moment to Breathe".

Helen Taylor gave a report on the book "Caste" by Isabel Wilkerson. This book is on the UWF Reading list.

Glenda Holcomb reported on the book, "Dream Like Jesus" by Rebecca Simon Peter. Glenda completed a 3-year study of this book along with others and it had a profound impact on her desire to address "Why Domestic Violence?" As a result, she and other Trinity District UMW (UWF) members have worked together to begin Anna's Mission "to help survivors of Domestic Violence in Southeast Colorado. Glenda showed a video about Anna's Mission.

Joyce Hudiburgh, another founder of Anna's Mission showed a video with statistics from the National Coalition Against Domestic Violence, then she presented data from Colorado, especially rural areas (communities with less than 50,000 population). This is a serious problem in all our communities.

Nettê Smith is also a founder. She showed an example of the bags that Anna's Mission is assembling, which contain, among things, toiletries, a prayer shawl and a Bible. The bags are taken to places where victims of Domestic Violence might be encountered. The recipient is encouraged to add documents and vital information, then leave the bag with a trusted friend in case she/he has to leave home quickly.

Today's attendees have the opportunity to support Anna's Mission by putting donations in the baskets. Donations can also be mailed to Anna's Mission, PO Box 4, Rocky Ford, CO 81067.

Frances Graves reported on "Love is the Way" by Bishop Michael Curry from the Reading List. As a Bishop in the Episcopal Church, his experiences and wisdom are familiar to United Methodists and we can learn from him how to address some of the challenges of the present day.

Roll Call: Yolanda Dietz, Coordinator of Membership, Nurture and Outreach read the list of all the active UWF units in the District. She noted that this has been a difficult year for her to get accurate membership numbers from units as only 50% have responded to her contacts. She asked that anyone with current information from the units reported as 0 members, please let her know.

Nettê Smith moved, seconded by Yolie Dietz to approve the minutes from the 2021 Annual Gathering. The motion passed.

The Budget for 2023 was presented by Helen Taylor, Treasurer. Denise Logan moved to accept the budget, seconded by Berniece McClure and the motion passed. Helen led the pledge service. She reminded units to send the amount they pledged to her by December 7. The offering for the District Pledge to Missions was received.
