*Telling Our Story – Hearing Yours* will be the theme for our Mile High Metro District Annual Meeting on Saturday, September 16, 2023, 9am – 1:30pm, at Phillips UMC, 1450 S. Pierce St, Lakewood, 80232. Our goal is to inform, connect, and learn with and from each other. We are so pleased to have Bishop Karen Oliveto as our featured speaker.

With so many changes to our denomination, our conference, district, and UWFaith, Bishop Karen will be speaking on "Where do we Go from Here". Our meeting will begin at 9am. There will be some business to attend to; approving the Minutes from our 2022 annual meeting, approving a 2024 budget and Pledge to Mission, Nominations and Election of Officers. Then we will hear from Bishop Karen for about an hour. This morning session will be live-streamed on the Phillips UMC YouTube page for those unable to attend in person. Flower Power – Seeds for Growth, led by Marcia Canter. This will be a craft class making small flowers to give to potential members. We also will be discussing membership ideas.

Moving Forward in UWFaith, led by Myrna Prentice, former Conference President. We will discuss some of the changes that Bishop Karen will talk about and what they mean to UWFaith.

The Charter for Racial Justice in Today's World, led by Donna Parisi. First adopted in 1952 as the Charter for Racial Policies, the Charter has been updated many times to reflect the changes in our society. It is more important now than ever before.

Zero Waste – The best kept secret to fighting Climate Change, led by Randy Moorman, Director of Policy and Campaigns at Eco-Cycle, and a Creation Care member at Arvada UMC. Randy will share the benefits of going Zero Waste and strategies we can implement now that will reduce greenhouse gas emission and reduce our impacts on God's creation.

We will finish our day with the Installation of Officers, a Memorial Service for those members we have lost in 2023, and Communion officiated by Rev. Melinda Baber.
