United Women in Faith Board of Directors were reminded that they serve a God of abundance, even in the midst of economic challenges, wrote Response Editor Audrey Stanton-Smith on the United Women in Faith website.

She wrote that the United Women in Faith Board of Directors met October 13-14 and approved eliminating five staff positions and relocating United Women in Faith headquarters to the Church Center for the United Nations (CCUN), which is owned by United Women in Faith. These changes will go into effect by the end of 2023. Two additional staff positions will be eliminated in 2024.

The action is an effort to align United Women in Faith mission with revenue. "What is your 'do it' moment?" President 'Ainise 'Isama'u asked the board prior to the action, reminding members about the organization's legacy of determination, compassion, and the pursuit of justice. "What are you willing to do to turn the ship around and steer it toward brighter shores? Dream it. Believe it. Do it. These are not just words; they are the pillars of our renewed faith and determination."

"The dreams we carry within us are the sparks that ignite change, and they are the visions of a better world for women, children, and youth," she continued. "We must believe in the power of our collective action." For more information, go to the <u>website</u>.



The United Methodist Church has more than 200 missionaries serving across the world.

All United Methodist Churches, including those in our Mountain

Sky Conference, pay a portion of our donations to support these United Methodist missionaries.

The United Women in Faith, also known as the United Methodist Women, is an official women's organization of the United Methodist Church.

The United Women in Faith groups have as their purpose to expand the mission program of the United Methodist Church. This women's organization has existed under several different names for over 150 years. These projects are supported by donations from the local units of the United Women in Faith, who give their offerings as "second mile" giving.

The projects and scholarships granted by the United Women in Faith every year are specifically planned for the needs of women children and youth around the world.

Karen Bueno has lived so many years! How can a bio be brief? Let's just talk about the twenty-first century.

Karen became passionate about the global mission work of the United Methodist Women, aka United Women in Faith in the early 2000s. She served as communications coordinator for the Denver Metro District, and then President of that District. She served on the Nominations team of the Mountain Sky Conference United Methodist Women and then as Education and Interpretation on that conference team. Karen expresses delight with our new name and the reintroduction of our reason for being as United Women in Faith. (Her passion for global mission work became intense when she traveled with a faith group around the world. That was in the last century.)

She joined her local Good Shepherd (Thornton) United Methodist Women in early 2000s and soon was nominated for leadership. Some wise and unwise actions of hers, she admits, resulted in a split of that group which caused a lot of pain in keeping the group in being. But we now have an active local membership. She has been named President of the local group for some time. A woman who took the Presidency role for a couple of years needed to move to another state to care for her aging parents, so Karen continued to serve as president because she cannot give up on our Purpose! The major goal for our local group is to add younger members who have joined our church in the last few years. Karen intends to find and nurture leaders to insure the longevity of United Women in Faith in our congregation.
