Director Update from Jana Jones

As a national UWFaith Director, it has been my great pleasure to also serve as a director on the General Board of Global Ministries. Over the last 3 years, during the pandemic, all the meetings have been virtual vs meeting (pre-pandemic) in Atlanta. After not meeting in person, General Secretary Roland Fernandes made the decision that we should meet where UMC mission is happening. GBGM met in Mozambique in April, which I was unable to attend. I just returned from our fall meeting in Cambodia. What an experience!

In Cambodia, I met UMC missionaries from all over Asia including Fiji, Japan, Laos, Mongolia, Nepal, the Philippines, South Korea, Taiwan, and of course, Cambodia. On behalf of United Women in Faith, I presented each of the 20 Missionaries present with a UWFaith Pin made available by the Grand Junction UWFaith. (Made by Navaho artists Darlene and Eugene Lansing and family in Aneth, Utah.) So many told me how much they appreciate Unite Women in Faith and the support that the women of the organization has given them, including birthday emails, prayers and words of support through the Daily Prayer Guide.





I was so delighted to meet Emma Cantor, our UWFaith Regional Missionary to the Philippines and Joy Prim, a Deaconess who serves in Hong Kong, (both pictured above). Emma works to facilitate gender training and leadership development. She told me, "Tell United Women in Faith, thank you, thank you, thank you for your support." Joy works in Hong Kong with migrant workers. (Note: Joy was so excited by the new UWFaith necklace that she immediately contacted Glenna Kyker Brayton and ordered several.)

In Cambodia, we visited a Street Children Ministry School in the slums of Phnom Pehn; the Susanna Wesley Dorm Ministry which houses young women from the provinces as they attend university; the Cambodian Methodist Bible School which is a school of theology, producing new church leaders. Hearing the stories of the missionaries and their work was deeply moving. And inspiring. We went to church at a local church where we removed our shoes, worshiped God together and sang familiar songs in English and Khmer at the same time.

During this month of gratitude, my heart is filled with gratitude for the opportunity to represent you, my sisters, in Cambodia. I am over-whelmed by what these dedicated missionaries are doing in the name of Christ, the United Methodist Church, and United Women in Faith to make a difference in the lives of the underserved throughout the world. THANK YOU! to our Annual Gathering Attendees and Planning Committee

I want to thank all our attendees (in person and on Zoom), as well as our wonderful Planning Committee for a great Annual Gathering. We had wonderful sessions—including an outstanding panel discussion, meaningful conversations, fabulous meals, Ubuntu projects, and amazing fellowship. We learned more about the Doctrine of Discovery and its cascading effects on Native Americans—including the lack of a coordinated official response to Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons (MMIP). We raised up MMIP through our Red Dress displays and we have an action item to display red dresses in our states' capitols on May 5, 2024 (Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls Awareness Day).

We also discussed and passed two resolutions during the meeting--urging the elimination of the Doctrine of Discovery from US case law; and a resolution urging additional state/local/federal/tribal actions on the MMIP issue. Copies of the resolutions have been shared with the National United Women in Faith office and we plan to present the resolutions at the Western Jurisdiction meeting in Anchorage in May 2024. Treasurer Tidbits

October 2023

WOW, it just hit me. This is my last Treasurer's Report after 11 years -4 as Utah/Western Colorado District and 7 as Mountain Sky Conference.

To date we have remitted \$91,491.26 towards our Pledge to Mission in 2023. Plus an additional \$10,736.40 in designated giving. Of that UMCOR donations were \$2350.00 and Call to Prayer and Self-Denial of \$4509.64.

We are 55% of the way to meeting our Pledge. This is typical for our giving pattern. However, I don't want anyone to think it is a slam dunk. We need to continue to encourage giving. Christmas card Gift to Mission is a great way to honor friends and family. If your District or Local Treasurer don't have any, please look to the website and print your own.

We welcome Connie Pittenger as the 2024 Conference Treasurer. She has had 4 successful years as the Utah/Western Colorado District Treasurer and many years as Treasurer of other civic organizations. Her attention to detail is an asset to the position and the Team.

We also welcome two new District Treasurers. Claudia Davis accepted the position for Western Mountains District part way through 2023 when Sandy Balliet needed to move out of the area. Anna Ball was elected in Utah/Western Colorado District in September.

Everyone should thank their District Treasurers as they encourage Mission giving at the local and district level. There are so many questions to answer.

MOUNTAIN SKY CONFERENCE of UNITED WOMEN in FAITH SOCIAL JUSTICE AND ACTION REPORT

November 2023

As I think about my time as the Social Justice and Action Coordinator, I ask myself how anyone in United Women in Faith ever "retires" from this office. Social Justice is part of who we are as United Women in Faith, and we find ourselves following our hearts as we take "social action." Feeding the hungry; caring for the poor; teaching the children; and speaking out for the voiceless; and advocating for women, children, and youth is built into who we are.

Since 1869, we have established hospitals and colleges. We have welcomed the immigrant. We have supported clergy and laypeople as they cared for the souls and bodies of people the world over. We have fought for the inclusion of women in areas of leadership in the church and in the public square. We have fought against injustice wherever we are.

During our annual meeting in October in Billings, Montana, we learned more about the Missing or Murdered Indigenous Persons movement and in what ways we can bring awareness of this tragic issue to our home communities. After hearing the stories around this topic, we found ourselves passing resolutions to raise awareness about MMIP at all levels of United Women in Faith; and to advocate the US government for the repudiation of the Doctrine of Discovery. These are major actions broken down into small bites: incorporating more books on these topics into our reading program; hosting sessions about these topics at meetings local and national, including the 2026 Assembly; urging the United Methodist Church to join us in these justice issues; and contacting public officials to advocate for justice in these areas.

My sisters, we are all Social Justice and Action Coordinators. This grows out of our commitment to Christ, as we move forward through our faith in God.

Leadership Training which we entitle Mission and Mentoring Day is set for January 27 at Littleton.

I Am You: A Book about Ubuntu by <u>Refilee Moahloli</u> Spiritual Growth


A BORK ABOUT UBUITU REFLOR MORALET REFLOR MORALET Zacido Probant

With simple, lyrical text and charming artwork, this lively picture book, first published in South Africa, is the perfect introduction to the concept of ubuntu for young kids. A celebration of friendship and kindness, the

book shows children the many ways that we are all one.


Saving American Beach (also Dec. 14th) by <u>Heidi Tyline King</u> Social Action

This heartfelt picture book biography tells the story of MaVynee Betsch, an African American opera singer turned environmentalist and the legacy she preserved.



MaVynee loved going to the beach. But in the days of Jim Crow, she couldn't just go to any beach--most of the beaches in Jacksonville were for whites only. Knowing something must be done, her grandfather bought a beach that African American families could enjoy without being reminded they were second class citizens; he called it American Beach.

After the Civil Rights Act desegregated public places, there was no longer a need for a place like American Beach and it slowly fell into disrepair. MaVynee remembered the importance of American Beach to her family and so many others, so determined to preserve this integral piece of American history, she began her second act as an activist and conservationist, ultimately saving the place that had always felt most like home.



The Proudest Blue (also Dec. 14th)by Ibtihaj MuhammadLeadership Development

A powerful, vibrantly illustrated story about the first day of school--and two sisters on one's first day of hijab--by Olympic medalist and social justice activist Ibtihaj Muhammad.

With her new backpack and light-up shoes, Faizah knows the first day of school is going to be special. It's the start of a brand new year and, best of all, it's her older sister Asiya's first day of hijab--a hijab of beautiful blue fabric, like the ocean waving to the sky. But not everyone sees hijab as beautiful, and in the face of hurtful, confusing words, Faizah will find new ways to be strong.
