Frasier Manor Retirement Community Update

Frasier Manor and Mountain View UMC are keeping their fingers crossed that the city of Boulder will approve plans to build 90+ additional apartments on a portion of property belonging to the church. If all goes well, Mountain View will sell 70% of its property to Frasier and demolish the older building. Site preparation will begin sometime later this year. In the meantime, the city is in the process of relocating the water main, as well as fiber cables, from the street (Ponca Pl.) between Frasier and Mountain View to the street behind the church (Pawnee Dr.) — a step that is required in order to make Ponca Pl. a private street. There are two advisory boards that must give their approval to the design and the transportation impacts before the city council makes the final decision. We'll keep you updated on developments at Frasier during the coming year.

That is why National UWFaith is officially launching the UNSTOPPABLE Growth Campaign at Assembly 2026 in Indianapolis May 14-17. But you don't have to wait to get started planning your unit's involvement. Advocacy for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls

The Mountain Sky Racial Justice Committee is trying to expand awareness and increase advocacy about Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons (MMIP). Although Congress has approved federal legislation to address the issue and some Mountain Sky state governors and legislatures have taken up the issue, we want to urge our state elected officials to consider declaring May 5 to be "A Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls." We have attached a letter, and a proposed resolution, that we hope you will consider sending to your governor, state legislative leaders, and your local state legislator in the hopes that they will take action prior to May 5. On behalf of the Mountain Sky Conference of United Women in Faith, as a constituent of the state of _____, I am writing to urge you to consider issuing an executive order (executive)/resolution (legislative) addressing the epidemic of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls in our state. Please consider modifying the attached resolution to meet the needs of our state and to raise the visibility of MMIW. This resolution is based upon a resolution introduced by U.S. Rep. Dan Newhouse (WA) in 2025. Unfortunately, Congress took no action on this resolution and has not offered funding or direction for raising the issue of MMIW in several years. We hope, by highlighting this issue at the state level, that Congress and the Trump administration will act in the coming months and years to address the heartbreak of MMIW for both its victims and their families.

In addition, we urge you to consider honoring MMIW in our state with a display of red dresses in the Capitol as a physical reminder of these women and girls and their families. We also urge you to wear RED on May 5 to honor and commemorate these women and girls.

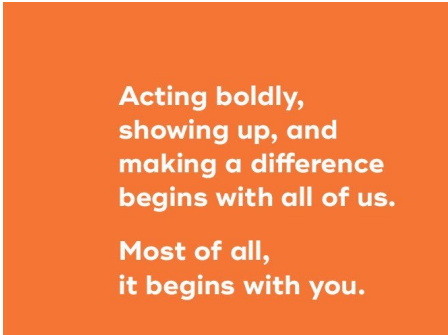

Proposed Proclamation Establishing a Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls

Whereas, according to a 2016 study commissioned by the US Department of Justice's (DOJ) National Institute of Justice (NIJ), more than 4 in 5 (84.3 percent) of American Indian and Alaska Native women experienced violence in their lifetime, with 56.1 percent being the result of sexual violence and 55 percent being from intimate partner violence;

Whereas, according to 2017 data, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) found homicide was the sixth-leading cause of death for American Indian and Alaska Native women and girls under 44 years of age, with murder rates more than 10 times the national average;

Whereas, approximately 1,500 American Indian and Alaska Native missing persons have been entered into the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) index throughout the United States, and approximately 2,700 cases of murder and nonnegligent homicide offenses have been reported to the federal government's Uniform Crime Reporting Program;

Whereas, according to a 2020 joint study completed by the state of Hawaii and the Hawaii State Commission on the Status of Women, 64 percent of human trafficking victims in Hawaii identified as at least part Native Hawaiian;

Whereas, the current local, state, and federal funding available in Indian country is inadequate to address the basic, emergency, and long-term service needs of victims and negatively impacts tribal governments' ability to distribute lifesaving resources;

Whereas, several federal acts and executive orders addressing Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women have been issued, there is a continuing need for better investigatory and prosecutorial coordination and cooperation among local, state, and federal agencies to address the epidemic of missing persons, and the murder and trafficking of American Indian, Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian peoples;

Whereas, despite progress that has been made, in 2024, 5,614 Indigenous Women and Girls were reported missing. Of these reports, 4,179 victims were under the age of 18. At the end of 2024, there were 628 active missing person records;

Whereas, research data shows that national averages hide the extremely high rates of murder against Indigenous women and girls in counties hosting tribal land; and

Whereas, May 5 has been designated as the day of remembrance for "Missing and Murdered Native Women and Girls" in honor of the birthdate of Hanna Harris, a member of the Northern Cheyenne Tribe, who was murdered after being reported missing by her family in Lame Deer, Montana.

Now, therefore, be it **Resolved**, that the state of _____

MMIP Resolution Continued . . .

- 1) Expresses support for the designation of a Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls;
- 2) Calls on the people of this state and interested groups to
 - a. Commemorate the lives of missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls whose cases are documented in public records and the media as well as cases that are undocumented but just as important to their families; and
 - b. Demonstrate solidarity with the families of victims in light of those tragedies;
- 3) Urges the U.S. Department of Justice’s National Institute of Justice to commission a new study with focused data on missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls to ensure up-to-date statistics are made public regarding the current state of the missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls given that 10 years have passed since the 2016 study was published; and
- 4) Recognizes that, despite the efforts made to date, there is more work to be done to address this nationwide crisis

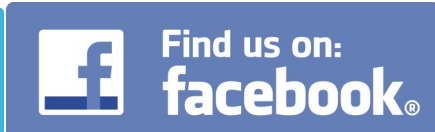

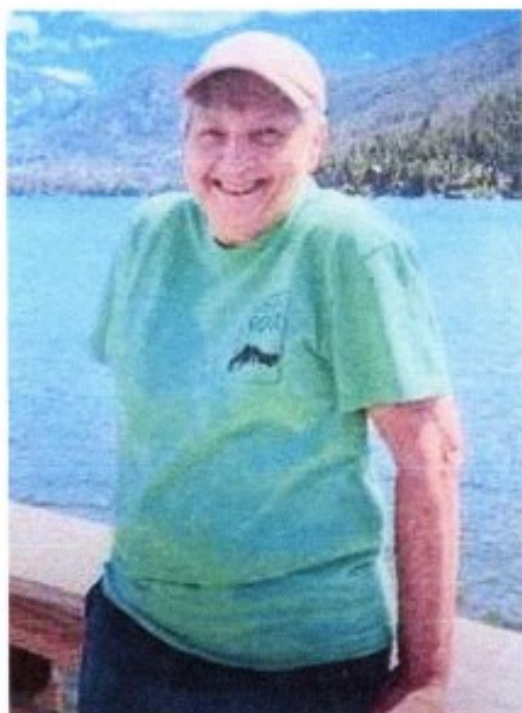
